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Katrin Neumann, M.D., is Professor of Phoniatrics and Pedaudiology and otolaryngologist. She is Director of the Dept. of Phoniatrics and Pedaudiology at the University Clinic of Münster, Germany. She contributes as member of the WHO Expert Advisory Board to the work of the WHO Programme of Prevention of Deafness and Hearing Loss and is the WHO officer of the Union of European Phoniatricians, of the German Society of Phoniatrics and Pediatric Audiology, and of the German Society of Audiology. She is former Chair of the Audiology Committee of the International Association of Logopedics and Pediatrics and of the Technology Committee of the Coalition for Global Hearing Health. She is Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Fluency Disorders and Associate Editor of Communication Disorders quarterly, received a couple of national and international awards, among others the European Phoniatrics Hearing EUHA Award of 2014, and has published more than 240 original articles, review articles, monographies, medical guidelines, and book chapters. She teaches voice physiology for the opera and voice classes at the University of the Arts, Berlin.

Her research focuses are: examination of speech, language, and hearing processes with neuroimaging techniques, implementation of newborn hearing screening, language screenings for children, and of a neonatal CMV screening, diagnostics and intervention programs for children, population medicine in pediatric audiology, nature and treatment of stuttering, signal analysis in voice physiology and pathology, singer's voice, diagnostics, treatment and rehabilitation of children with hearing aids, cochlear implants, and other hearing implants. She has initiated and chaired elaboration of the German Guideline on the pathogenesis, assessment and treatment of speech fluency disorders and coordinates at current the German Guideline on developmental language disorders.
